Monday

On Mondays I work from home and I start the week with a Zoom catch up with my mentor. Next is a client kickoff call for the next wave of our quantitative HDV Awareness, Trial, and Usage (ATU) project. I am familiar with the project as I also worked on the previous wave and I had an opportunity to help draft parts of the deck last week\*. My responsibility will be to take notes about client feedback and amends the team needs to make to the deck. After catching up on emails I prepare for a discussion about feedback on pilot interviews from my qualitative CAR-T project. Last week we listened to a pilot interview from Singapore and took notes regarding how we could improve, such as more coaching for the moderator or editing the discussion guide.

After lunch I work on a few PowerPoint slides for our HDV ATU project as part of a follow up request from a client.
